Overall Assessment and Comments

Prior to the visit, the college submitted self-evaluative reports of each department which the audit team analyzed. The audit team visited the departments and interacted with faculty members. The academic and administrative audit report demonstrates the progressive trend of the college and its performance and ranking at the national level.

About the College

St. Thomas College was founded as an educational institution in 1889 by Rt. Rev. Adolphus Edwin Medlycott, the Vicar Apostolic of Thrissur. The institution became a second-grade college in April 1919, with Fr. John Palocaren as the first Principal. The College rose to the status of a First Grade College in March 1925. With the formation of Universities in Kerala, the College was affiliated to the University of Kerala in 1957 and to the University of Calicut in 1968.

The college is recognized by UGC under sections **2(f)** and **12 (B)**. The college was last accredited by **NAAC** with 'A' grade, CGPA of 3.4 in 2016 and became an **Autonomous** institution from 2014. Vision of the college is "Transforming the youth through holistic education towards an enlightened society".

- ❖ NIRF Ranking: St. Thomas College (Autonomous), Thrissur is placed within the first 100 best colleges in India in NIRF India Ranking (79th position in 2018; 54th position in 2019).
- ❖ The college has received College with Potential Excellence status from UGC on April 2016.
- The institution was supported with **RUSA** funding in August 2019.

CURRICULAR AND TEACHING LEARNING ASPECTS

- ❖ The evaluative report indicates a well-conceived, adopted and implemented Outcome Based Education (OBE) through a moderately flexible CBCSS across all UG and PG programmes. Programme Outcomes have been defined and uploaded on the college website.
- ❖ It is highly lauded that three very innovative programmes have been started in the college exercising academic autonomy, namely, undergraduate programmes in Criminology and Police Science, Data Science and Forensic Science.
- ❖ It is observed that this is one of the first Arts & Science HEI to have adopted OBE in Kerala. The faculty have been subjected to several rounds of training programmes in this regard.
- The CBCSS curriculum framework for UG programmes has included several scopes of learning through
 - Core, Complementary and Languages
 - Open Course
 - Electives
 - Audit courses
 - Certificate courses
- The CBCSS curriculum framework for PG programmes has included several scopes of learning through:
 - Core courses
 - Elective courses
 - Audit courses
 - Certificate courses
- Special attention was paid, while designing/revising curriculum to sensitize students to issues of gender discrimination, ideals of the Indian Constitution, human rights, human values and professional ethics.
- Courses having focus on employability and skill development have been incorporated in the curriculum.
- ❖ The syllabus has been **revised in 2019 and 2020** which is in tune with the vision and mission of college. The number of programmes revised is given below

Value-added courses have been included to cater to the need of the society with the objective to provide employability.

- Number of value-added courses conducted is as following: 27 value-added courses in 2018-19 and 34 courses in 2019-20.
- ❖ The college facilitates student-centric learning with initiatives such as Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP), SASAP (Santhome Academic and Social Assistance Programme), UGC-NET and JAM coaching, UGC assisted Remedial Coaching for Weaker sections, Remedial Coaching for Underperforming students, Walk With Scholar (WWS) and Research Methodology Courses.
- ❖ Feedback on curriculum is taken annually from students, alumni, faculty and employers on a five-point scale. Analysis reports and Action taken reports are published on college website.

About the Department:

The Department of Botany was started in 1951with the introduction of first batch of Natural Science in the Intermediate. The department has been offering Undergraduate programme since 1958 and the Postgraduate programme since 1968. The department was elevated to the status of Research Centre of University of Calicut since 2014. There are 8 faculty members of which 7 have PhD.

- Curriculum is revised periodically (PG-2019, 2020; UG-2019, 2020) which is in tune with the vision and mission of college.
- Outcome based syllabus has been introduced. PSO and CO is included in the revised curriculum.
- All the faculty in the department are involved in revision of syllabi.
- Courses having focus on employability and skill development have been incorporated.

- The department offers 2 value added courses- Certificate Course in Horticulture (UG); Certificate Course in Advanced pharmacognosy and phytochemistry (PG); Certificate course in Plant tissue culture (PG)
- Lesson plan is prepared by all the faculty members.
- Teacher-student ratio is good.
- Mentoring is done by the faculty for all students for about 3-4 hrs. per semester.
- Pass percentage of UG (2018-2019-96.77%; 2019-20-98.36%) and PG program (100%) is excellent.
- The teaching-learning pedagogy involves experiential learning such as project, study trips, assignment and group discussions.
- ICT-enabled teaching pedagogy is followed.
- The faculty are competent with 22 publications, 70 presentations/participations in seminars and acted as resource persons (13)

- Research is actively performed in the department with 4 research guides and 17 research scholars (mostly with fellowships)
- Research projects funded by Government agencies;3 Minor projects from KSCSTE.

- Syllabus of UG and PG has been designed Outcome based. PSO and CO is included in the revised curriculum.
- All the faculty in the department are involved in revision of syllabi.
- Courses having focus on employability and skill development have been incorporated.

- UGC NET Coaching is offered by the department.
- The department offers 2 value added courses; Certificate Programme in Plastic processing and Rubber technology (UG); Certificate programme in instrumental analytical techniques (PG)
- Lesson plan is prepared by all the faculty members.
- Teacher-student ratio in the department is good.
- Mentoring is done by the faculty for all students for about 3-4 hrs. per semester.
- Pass percentage of UG (86.67% in 2018-2019 and 100% in 2019-20) and PG program (100%) are good.

- Research infrastructure with modern equipments including XRD is good.


