NIRF INDIA RANKING 2020

The College participated in the NIRF Ranking 2020. The data was submitted on 8th January 2020. When NIRF Ranking 2020 results were announced by MHRD, St. Thomas College (Autonomous), Thrissur, secured 63rd Rank in India with 53.42 points and 8th position among the Colleges in Kerala. It is the third consecutive year that the college has found a place among the best 100 Colleges in India as per NIRF Ranking parameters.



4.5 STARS: Innovation and Start-up in the Campus

IQAC and Innovation Cell jointly took initiatives to collect data and submitted the credentials of the college to participate in Atal Ranking of Institution on Innovation Achievement (ARIIA) for the category of 'Institutions and Colleges (Govt. and Govt. Aided) during the academic year. MHRD'S Innovation Cell recognized the innovation initiatives of the college.



RUSA Funding

The initiative of IQAC became successful when the college was granted with Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) Funding of Rupees Two Crores on 29 August 2019. The fund was earmarked for the enhancement of infrastructure and Research facilities in the college. The college submitted the project for purchasing Research equipments, construction of multi-purpose hall and for the renovation of the existing Postgraduate Hostel building.

STAR College Scheme by DBT

IQAC took initiatives to apply for Star College Scheme by DBT for the college. As a result, St. Thomas College, Thrissur, was recognized by the Department of Bio-Technology and was sanctioned with Rupees 82 Lakhs for strengthening of Life Sciences and Bio-Technology Education and training at Undergraduate Level under the Star College Scheme, for a period of three years. The sanction letter was issued on 29 February 2020.

Quality Initiatives by IQAC

Revisiting Vision & Mission of St. Thomas College

A workshop entitled 'Revisiting Vision & Mission of St. Thomas College' was organized in the conference hall by IQAC for the representatives of Management, administration, college council and IQAC on 12th June 2019. Dr. Anil George K, IQAC Coordinator welcomed the manager, the resource person and the participants. Mar Tony Neelankavil, the Manager, underlined the importance of the event. He said that the vision and mission are to be rearticulated in the context of changing times when the college has crossed over a century of its existence.

Dr. Abraham Mathew SDB from Chennai was the resource person. He said that it is the stakeholders who collectively deliberate, evolve and bring in modifications to the vision and mission, if any. However, he detailed the philosophy and process in re-articulating the vision and mission. He helped in orienting the participants and the need to revisit the Vision and Mission of a century old college in the changed scenario. It was decided to carry out the process in the coming days with the involvement of all stakeholders in various sessions. Dr. Joy K. L, Principal, thanked the resource person and the participants.



Policy Documents

Policy Documents were further enhanced and revised by incorporating new policies as per the requirements from the management, government, affiliating university and other statutory bodies. The revised policy documents were promulgated with the approval of the Governing Council.

Preparation of Academic Calendar

The Academic Calendar for the new academic year was prepared by taking inputs from Governing council, academic council, office of the CoE, college council, principal, departments, cells and clubs

under the leadership of Dr. Thomas M.T. The proposed events and data were collected, collated and streamlined. Academic Calendar of the college was prepared taking into consideration the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in the College and the proposed examination schedules.

Quality Audits

Green & Energy audit

An internal Green, Energy and Water Audit was conducted by IQAC during the academic year under the leadership of Energy Audit Cell with the support of student volunteers from the departments of Botany and Physics. Dr. Joby Paul spearheaded the initiative.

Gender audit

To evaluate and understand the aspect of Gender Sensitivity in the campus, a Gender Survey and Audit was jointly conducted by IQAC and Women's Cell, St. Thomas College, Thrissur in December 2019. The final year UG students were the participants and they were handed out a questionnaire carrying fifteen Gender Sensitive questions. Students were granted full anonymity. Survey results were analysed and the findings were submitted to the principal and college council for adopting enhance and corrective measures.

Accreditation / Certification / Ranking

Participation in NIRF Ranking 2020

In order to participate in NIRF Ranking 2020, data was collected from departments and all relevant academic and co-curricular units. Institutional, departmental, faculty and student Data of 2018-2019 was collected exhaustively with the support of SQAC, DQAC and IQAC core team members. Data was cleaned and processed as per the proforma. Before the final submission, the credentials were presented before the college council and was approved in the management committee meeting.

AISHE Data Submission

Annual data collection and submission to the online portal of All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) for the academic year was successfully completed by the IQAC and the data submitted was approved by AISHE on 18 February, 2020.

AQAR, KSHEC Data Submission

Submission of Annual Quality Assurance Report for the year 2018-2019 was made online by NAAC for the first time. The college registered with the NAAC website with unique credentials. Data collected was uploaded online. The final submission of AQAR for the current academic year was done on 27 December, 2019.

Data for Kerala State Higher Education Council (KSHEC) portal was also prepared as per requirements of the online format. The data prepared was approved by the management committee and submitted in due course of time.

ISO Certification

IQAC kicked off initiatives towards obtaining ISO certification for the institution as part of its quality benchmarking process. It was decided to carry out ISO certification in two steps. In the first stage, the college office will be ISO-certified, followed by the ISO certification of the all aspects of the institution. It was decided to realize the process with the support of an external team.

Initiatives for NAAC 4th Cycle Accreditation

Workshop on Quality Enhancement and NAAC Accreditation

A workshop for the faculty was organized by IQAC on revised NAAC Accreditation process on 3 August 2019 in the Menachery Seminar Hall. Dr. S. V. Sudheer, Director, HRDC, Kerala University, was the resource person for the event. Dr. Anil George K, IQAC Coordinator, welcomed the participants. Fr. Varghese Kuthur, Executive Manager, addressed the gathering. Dr. Joy K. L., Principal, presided over the meeting. A session was organized exclusively for the IQAC members and representatives of the management in the conference hall in the afternoon to utilize the expertise of Dr. S. V. Sudheer.

Faculty Self-Appraisal

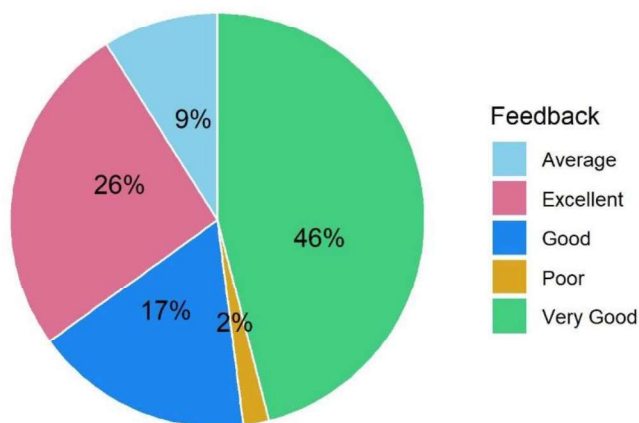
As part of quality assurance strategy, self-appraisal of faculties was collected from all teachers and submitted to Mar Tony Neelankavil, Manager. The process was aimed at assessing the performance and the continuous enhancement of teaching-learning, research and co-curricular endeavours of faculty members.

Feedback Mechanisms

Feedback on curriculum

Feedback on curriculum was collected from students, teachers, alumni and employers through online and offline methods. The collected data were collated, processed and statistically analysed. The analysis report was posted on the college website. Discussions regarding the recommendations and suggestions put forth by the stakeholders were conducted in the respective department councils based on the instructions given by IQAC. The proposed changes regarding the curriculum were discussed and ratified by the Board of studies and Academic Council. The summary and action taken report of the same was posted on the college website.

Sample snapshot from analysis of feedback on syllabus by students

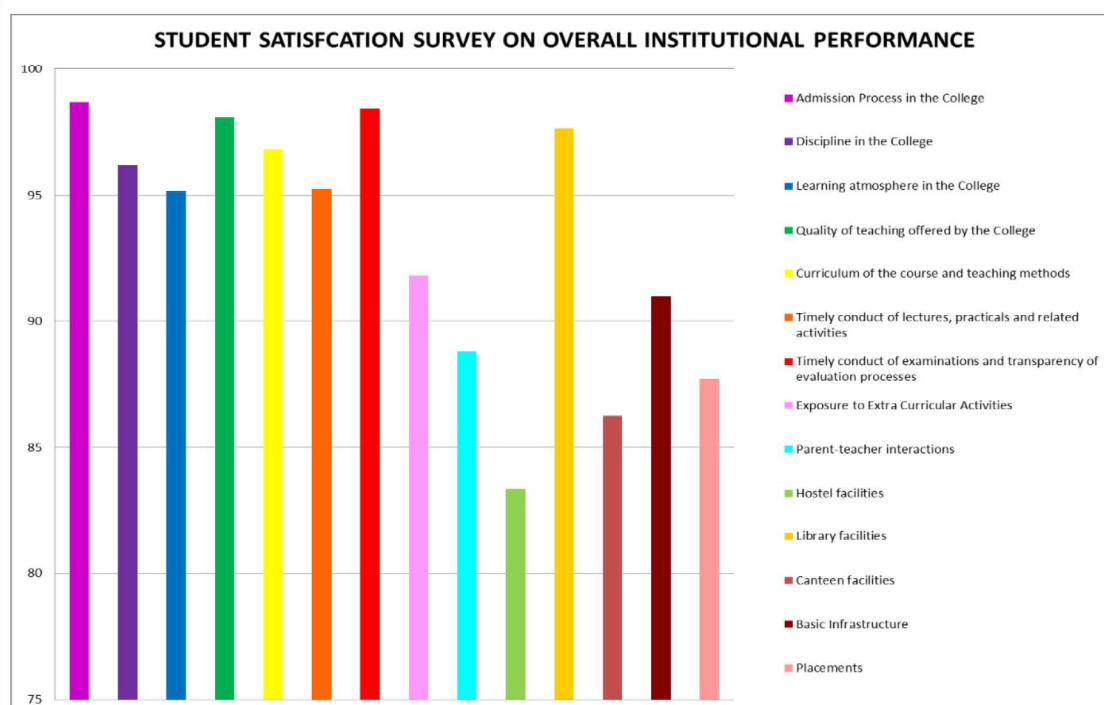
Feedback on teacher evaluation

Feedback on teacher evaluation by students was collected through STAMS, the online ERP platform of the college. The input of the feedback was automatically processed by the online tool. The analysis of the feedback was evaluated and made available to the respective teachers for further improvement in

the teaching learning process. Principal took corrective and enhanceive measures with the individual teachers wherever necessary.

Student Satisfaction Survey in the Campus

A students satisfaction survey was conducted among the students using a customized questionnaire designed by the IQAC. The feedback covered questions on academics, infrastructure, quality of teaching, placement prospects, library and discipline. The feedback was processed, analysed and the findings were submitted before the college council. After discussions in the councils, the suggestions were submitted to the Management through Bursar and necessary actions were taken.



Exit Survey for the Outgoing Students

Exit survey was conducted for the out-going students which plays a significant role in the institutional planning. The survey consists of two sections; the first enquires about the achievement of student learning outcomes and the second asks about satisfaction with various aspects and services of the college.

Survey on Online Teaching

A survey regarding online teaching was conducted for students to evaluate the effectiveness, efficacy and to take corrective and enhanceive measures. Feedback was taken from teachers on online teaching to perceive the challenges and hurdles faced by teachers during the Pandemic regarding teaching-learning process.

Documentation and Newsletters

In order to strengthen documentation, Chronicle, the college newsletter, was released in Oct 2019 and May 2020. In addition, a new initiative was introduced during the academic year. The initiative of Daily Newsletter was introduced this year, which was released online in the college website every day. Ms. Anu Paul, Assistant Professor, department of English, is the chief editor of the daily newsletter. Regular data collection is supported by the SQAC members.

Curriculum Development/Restructuring

Based on the feedbacks on syllabus and to the needs of the emerging times, the curriculum and syllabus in the college was restructured and revamped. Training programmes on curriculum, workshops on outcome-based education and orientations were organized in preparation for the implementation of the new curriculum and syllabus.

Faculty Development on Outcome Based Education

A workshop series on Outcome Based Education (OBE) was conducted at different levels to equip the faculty with the sound knowledge on OBE, mapping outcomes and developing corresponding evaluation patterns. The sessions gave an introduction of OBE, learning objectives, outcomes and their assessment method for attainment of outcomes.

Workshop on Outcome Based Education in collaboration with KSHEC



A two-day workshop on Outcome Based Education was organized by IQAC in collaboration with Kerala State Higher Education Council (KSHEC), Thiruvananthapuram for the selected representatives from all departments on 26 and 27 August 2019. The purpose of the workshop was to be introduced to the Outcome based learning, bloom's taxonomy and drafting Program outcomes (PO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO) and Course Outcomes (CO). The workshop was inaugurated by Fr. Varghese Kuthur, Executive Manager in the presence of Dr. Joy K. L., Principal. Dr. Manulal P. Ram, Dr. Shefeeque V

and Dr. Saji Mathew, the research officers, KSHEC, were the resource persons of the workshop. The workshop was highly interactive, hands on and using online resources.

A department level follow-up workshop on Outcome Based Education

IQAC organized a follow-up workshop at the departmental level with the help of the faculty who participated in the workshop on OBE on 19 September 2019 in the departments.

Workshop for Syllabus revision and Outcome Based Education

A third workshop for Syllabus revision and on outcome-based education at the departmental level was organized on 19 October 2019 at the departmental level to finalize the PSO and CO for respective programs and courses. The finalized PSO and CO were later submitted to the Syllabus Monitoring Committee for review.



Faculty Development Workshop on Revisiting Program Outcomes, PSOs & Course Outcomes

A hands-on workshop was arranged by IQAC, St. Thomas College (Autonomous), Thrissur, on 10 February 2020 in College Conference Hall. The workshop was organized for the Heads of the Departments and the Department wise syllabus Coordinators to equip them to define the Course Outcomes as well as to map them with the Programme Outcomes and Programme Specific Outcomes. The Department Syllabus Coordinators and HODs were responsible to train all the teachers in the respective departments to develop their course outcome and to map them with the PSOs and POs. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Joy K L, Principal. Dr. Anil George K, IQAC Coordinator, welcomed the teaching faculty from various departments. He also explained the necessity of mapping the course outcomes with the PSOs and POs. Dr. Shefeeque V, Research Officer, Kerala State Higher Education Council (KSHEC), Thiruvananthapuram, was the resource person of the workshop. A Symposium on ‘Draft National Education Policy-2019’

A symposium entitled ‘Draft National Education Policy-2019: Perspectives and Responses on Higher Education’ was organized by IQAC on 12th July, 2019. Sri. K. Jayakumar IAS (Retd), former chief Secretary, Government of Kerala and Dr. Fr. Prasanth Johnson Palackapilly CMI, Principal, SH College, Thevara, Kochi and Mar Tony Neelankavil, the Manager, were the main resource persons of the event.

Dr. Sr. Alphonsa Mathew, Joint IQAC Coordinator, welcomed the panellists and the participants. Dr. Joby Thomas K., Vice Principal, delivered introductory talk during the event. Dr. Fr. Prasanth, one of the panellists, welcomed the proposals in the draft National Education Policy 2019. However, Sri. K. Jayakumar IAS, critically commented various articles on the draft NEP. He commented that the proposed NEP documents appeared to be elitist in character. Mar Tony Neelankavil expressed concern about the politicisation of education over some of the proposals. The faculty interacted with the panellists for clarifications and expressing concerns. It was decided to communicate the concerns and deliberations of the symposium to the Committee responsible for drafting national education policy.

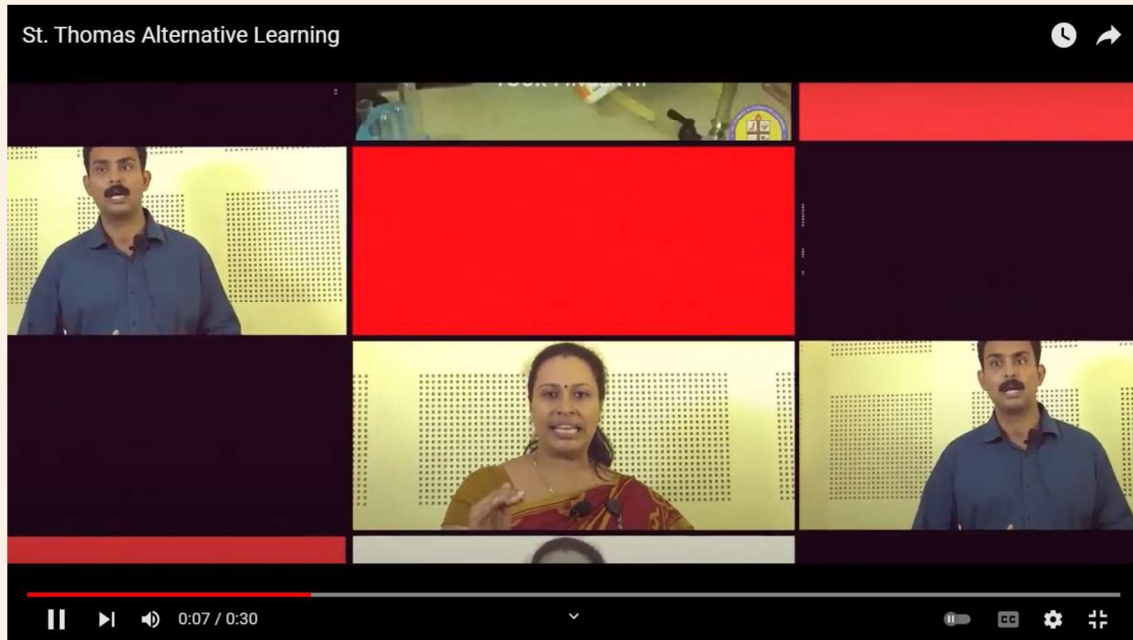
The college library is completely automated with KOHA. Besides, online journals and other online resources are availed in the college library.

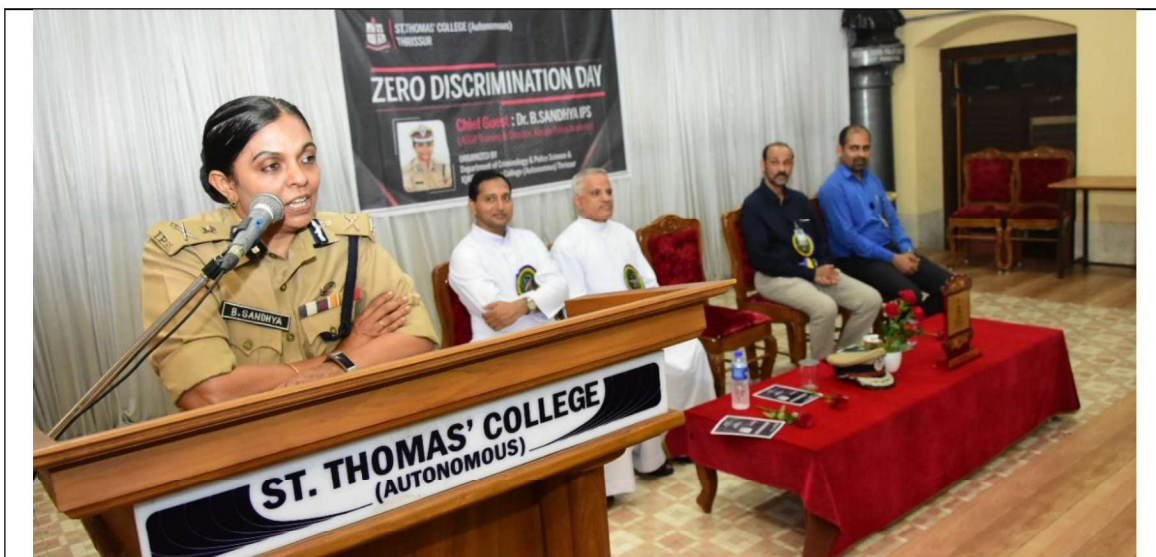


Infrastructural Enhancements for the Divyangjan

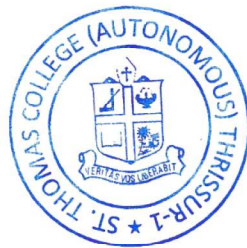
