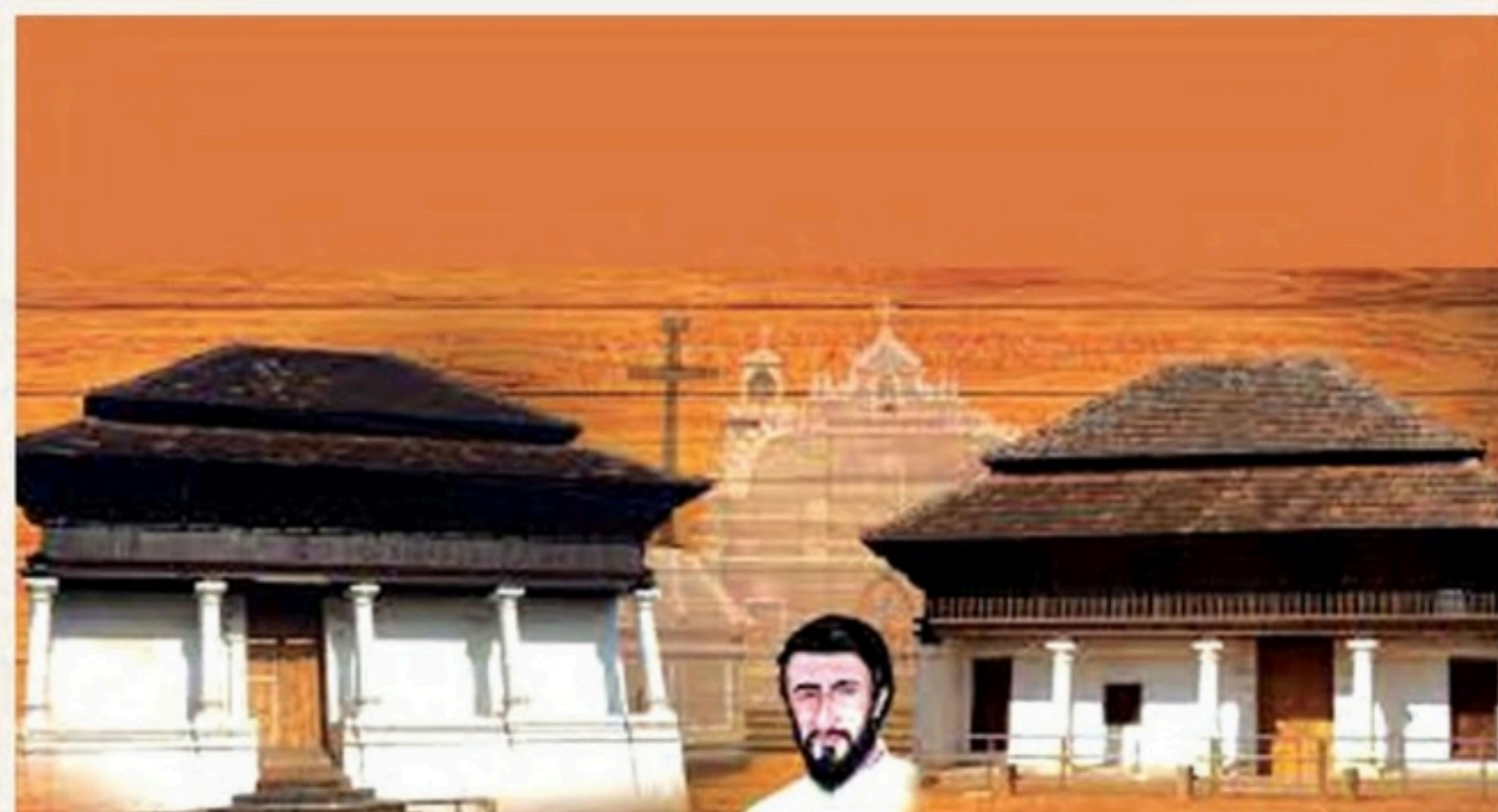

Prof. N.I. Ouseph had made invaluable contribution through his writings in the field of Theology and Lay leadership. He was the founder member of Catholic Union of Thrissur, Vice President of All India Catholic Union, Chairman of Catholic Union (Thrissur), CBCI, Consultant of CRI Commission for Vocation, Managing Editor of Tempest Magazine, and Consultant of CBCI Educational Commission.

Prof. Ouseph was in the forefront of the several agitations like the one against O.P. Thyagi Bill and Vimochana Samaram. He was an activist in the fight for upholding the rights of the Minorities in India.

Taking into consideration the contributions of Prof. Ouseph to the Christian community, the Pope invested the title of Grand Chevalier on him. Awards secured by him include Kerala Sabhathaaram Award, All India Catholic Congress Atheethi Award etc. His eldest son Bishop Mar Tony Neelankavil, also an alumnus of St. Thomas College and he is the Auxiliary Bishop of Thrissur Archdiocese.

Though affable and humble in his demeanor, Prof. N.I. Ouseph could transform himself into totally different person when addressing the public on issues involving Minority rights and allied issues.
